## 3 Content Recommendations

Suggested length for the report is 2-7 pages. In addition to a technical description of your method, please include details about the training data that you used. In particular, if you used external data include the name of the dataset, the number of images in it, how the images were collected (if it is not a public dataset), the annotation type such as image-level label or instance-level boxes or polygons, and a list of the categories that are annotated. The report should include a detailed ablation study (using the validation set) that documents the improvements due to your method relative to a baseline. The awards committee will decide on the best paper award based on the submitted reports.
